## BLURRED LINES AT SQUAT

The lines between art, design and architecture are continually blurring and merging, as demonstrated at art fairs such as Masterpiece and PAD. Establishing this further is Squat, a project founded in 2012 by Nilufar Gallery owner Nina Yashar, which is popping up in Mayfair this month. Following the success of previous editions in Paris, Beirut and Milan, Squat has teamed up with Shalini Misra and Mehves Ariburnu, director and creative advisor at Shalini Misra Ltd, to transform one of the interior and architectural design firm's development projects, a 230 sq m Victorian corner apartment on

South Audley Street, into a high-concept design space.

Open now, Squat presents unique pieces from Nilufar's collection including historic works by Gio Ponti and Ico Parisi, and more contemporary works by Patricia Urquiola, Martino Gamper and Bethan Laura Wood.

"Squat is an innovative concept that combines design, art and architecture to give life to a new, original and high standard domestic landscape," says Yashar. "I have always been keen on creating new and unexpected associations between furniture and space."
